the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, ¹²saying, “Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen.”

¹³Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, “Who are these, clothed in white robes, and from where have they come?” ¹⁴I said to him, “Sir, you know.” And he said to me, “These are the ones coming out of the great tribulation. They have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.

Lesson 8: The Egypt Exit - God delivers His People. We learn about the ten terrible plagues in Egypt and how Pharaoh relents and lets the Israelites leave Egypt to worship in the wilderness. When the Pharaoh realizes the Israelites are not going to return, he sends his army to pursue them. The Israelites are caught between the Pharaoh's charioteers and the waters of the Red Sea. They cry out to God for help. Moses stretches his hand over the sea as God parts the water and enables His people to pass through the Red Sea on dry ground. As Pharaoh's army attempts to follow the Israelites, the sea closes in over the army so not one survives. As you reflect on this lesson, think about how God protects us from our enemies every day.
